- **The University of Findlay Oilers won the NCAA Division II National Championship** on Saturday, March 28, in Springfield, Mass. The Oilers, now 36-0, topped unranked California State Polytechnic at Pomona 56-53 in overtime to take the title.

- **The Oilers, the NCAA No. 1-ranked team all season, is the first unbeaten national champion team since Cal**

State-Bakersfield in 1993. Televised on CBS, the championship game was a standoff with the score tied at 53, with both teams playing tremendous defense, effectively containing scoring. During overtime play, Josh Bostic, the Oilers'

NCAA Division II Player of the Year, fouled out and senior guard Tyler Evans replaced him on the court. In a heart-stopping move with 2.4 seconds of play, Evans received a pass from Marcus Parker and swished a shot from 25 feet as Oilers fans at the Mass Mutual Center, and those watching at home in the Jim and Mira Houdeshell Court in Croy Center, erupted in jubilation.

- **The team will go down as the NCAA**

Division II team with the most wins in a single season and only the fourth unbeaten national champion in D-II history. Each member of the team signed the game ball for inclusion in the College Basketball Hall of Fame. Veteran 24-year coach Ron Niekamp has never had a losing season at Findlay and now has a 550-174 record. Assistant coach Charlie Ernst, who played for Niekamp before joining the staff in 1992, honed the team's defensive skills that played such a vital role in the 36-0 season.

- **When the team bus returned to Findlay at 1:30 p.m. Sunday, hundreds of supporters welcomed the team members and coaches** in front of Croy Gymnasium. As longtime coach Ron Niekamp held the national championship trophy and the net from the championship game, senior members of the team and each coach spoke, thanking the fans who had supported the team throughout the years.

- **While UF sent three busloads and numerous private vehicles traveled to Springfield to watch the tournament games, support remained strong at home as well.** UF hosted a "United for the Oilers" community party on Saturday during the championship game. About 1,000 fans crowded into Croy Gymnasium in Findlay to watch Saturday's championship game, televised nationally on CBS and projected on two large screens. "We wanted to make this a community event so everyone could share the spirit and the excitement of the game," said David Emsweller,

vice president for student services at the University. "The whole Findlay community had supported the Oilers throughout this 36-0 season, and we wanted to be sure everyone had the chance to support them in the title game."

- **After defeating unbeaten, No. 2-ranked C.W. Post, 89-79, in the Elite Eight matchup** on Wednesday, the Oilers played the NCAA semi-

final game on Thursday with a thrilling 67-65 win over sixth-ranked Central Missouri. A crowd estimated at more than 750 turned out at Croy Center to watch the semifinal game on two large screens.
