Tenure-Track Position in Physical Therapy

The University of Findlay invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position in Physical Therapy to begin in August 2009 in the University's Doctor of Physical Therapy Program.

A doctorate in physical therapy (DPT) with Board certification or a terminal doctorate in a related field is required. Applicants must possess an Ohio Physical Therapy license or be eligible for licensure in Ohio and have a minimum of three years of clinical experience. Prior college teaching experience is preferred. Teaching to be assigned based on area of expertise in theory and clinical courses. Rank as assistant or associate professor and salary are commensurate with qualifications. Candidates must be committed to student-centered education as well as professional development and scholarship.

The University of Findlay is a Carnegie Master's/L institution which has grown from 1,500 to nearly 4,500 students in the last twenty years and is the largest private university in northwest Ohio. Founded in 1882, The University provides innovative programs grounded in the liberal arts and sciences to prepare students for meaningful lives and productive careers. The DPT is the largest graduate program in the College of Health Professions at the University. Both traditional and weekend degree programs are offered in physical and occupational therapy.
