Tenure-Track Position in Occupational Therapy

The University of Findlay invites applications for a tenure-track position in occupational therapy to begin July 1, 2010 in the University's College of Health Professions Occupational Therapy programs.

Candidates will be expected to teach undergraduate and graduate courses in the weekend and traditional MOT programs.

College teaching experience and a strong clinical background preferred. A master's degree in occupational therapy is required; a doctorate, however, is preferred. Candidates must be certified and have an Ohio occupational therapy license or be eligible for licensure. Rank as assistant or associate professor and salary are commensurate with qualifications. Candidates must be committed to student-centered undergraduate education as well as professional development and scholarship.
