## Immigration Highlight

### Don't Throw It Away!

Some of the most important paperwork an international student will have is their immigration paperwork. This includes passports, visas, I-94 cards, I-20's and any applications made to the USCIS like work authorizations or a change of status. Sometimes students will receive new and updated documents. For example, when a student applies for CPT they will receive a new I-20. A common mistake students make is to throw away their old immigration documents. Do not ever throw away any of your immigration documents or copies of applications you've made to the USCIS. They are a record of what you've been doing in the U.S. Even if you have graduated and have changed to an H1-B visa, keep your F-1 documents in a safe place. You may need to show proof with one of these documents years down the road.
