## Who We Are

Location: Findlay, Ohio, a small Midwestern city that has been designated a “dream town” by BizJournals.com and for the past 10 years has been named in the Top 20 for new and expanding facilities by Site Selection magazine.

**Program Highlights:** Nearly 60 majors leading to baccalaureate degrees and nine graduate and professional degrees. Our largest programs are pre-veterinary medicine, equestrian studies, business, pharmacy and education.

**History:** UF is a private institution founded by the Churches of God, General Conference, and the citizens of the city of Findlay, Ohio, in 1882.

**Accreditations:** The University of Findlay is authorized by the Ohio Board of Regents and accredited by the Higher Learning Commission as well as the national accrediting organizations for athletic training, teacher education, physical therapy, occupational therapy, physician assistant, nuclear medicine technology, social work and environmental, safety and occupational health management. Its pharmacy program holds candidate status with the Accreditation Council on Pharmaceutical Education.

**National Reputation:** UF ranks in the top tier of U.S. News & World Report’s “America’s Best Colleges” in the Midwest and was named a Best Midwestern College by the Princeton Review for the

past four years. It has been recognized as one of “America’s Best Private Colleges” by Institutional Research and Evaluation Inc., an independent research organization specializing in higher education.

**Campus Life:** More than 60 student organizations and over 300 student events each year. More than 1,300 live on campus in residence halls, apartment-style cottages and special interest houses.

**Athletics:** 23 intercollegiate sports (NCAA Division II and IHSA), club teams and 27 intramural sports.

**Financial Assistance:** We offer merit scholarships ranging from \$9,000 to \$14,000. The average need-based financial aid package at UF was about \$19,944 for full-time freshmen in fall 2009.

- Merit scholarships – ranging from \$9,000 to \$14,000, based on GPA and ACT or SAT scores;
- Athletic scholarships;
- Performance awards for students involved in theater and music;
- Need-based financial aid – based on FAFSA results and financial need; and
- Endowed scholarships – available sophomore through senior years.
