Did you know?

Did you know The International Admissions & Services Director, Martin Bennett, was also an international student? Below are some facts about his journey in America.

Where are you from?

I was born in Surrey, England. Both my parents are British. I spent the first five years of my life in the UK.

What brought you to America?/ When did you arrive?

My father's company transferred him (and our family) to their world headquarters in St. Louis, Missouri in 1974. I entered the US for the first time on an L-2 visa (intra-company transfer dependent). So, I, too, was an international student during my elementary school years. I became a U.S. citizen shortly before my 18th birthday.

What made you want to work with educational institutions?

I started working for my alma mater, Marquette University in 1993, in the admissions office. That position quickly became focused on international student recruitment and I was hooked! As a political science and history major, I've always been fascinated with geography and cultures and how different people interact. I truly believe that working in higher education I have a responsibility to help connect students to institutions that can change their lives forever for the better. I personally grew up at college, and developed the skills I needed to conquer any task set before me, wherever in the world that might take me. I want others to have that opportunity as well.

If you were to give international students one piece of advice, what would it be?

I would encourage all international students to make the most of their time here in the U.S. and at UF to get involved in campus organizations, participate in events, and make as many friends as possible while you are here.
