In addition to performing on and off Broadway and on national tours, she has appeared on various televisions shows, including "Frazier," "Another World," "Late Night with Conan O'Brien"

and "Law and Order." Most recently, Butler held the position of state project director, Ohio Cadre for the Gates Foundation Completion by Design Grant for Sinclair Community College, Dayton, Ohio. She has also held concurrent positions as the dean of the Learning Centers and the senior director of marketing for Sinclair. While at Sinclair, Butler was responsible for strategic marketing, recruiting and communications for the entire Sinclair Community College system. Under her guidance, the number of new students for fall 2012 increased

Maria Karagianis, award-winning writer, journalist and social entrepreneur, comes to The University of Findlay as the Woodrow Wilson Visiting Fellow Scholar for 2013 through The Council of Independent Colleges in Washington, D.C. She will be on campus Feb. 4-8, interacting with students and presenting in classes. She also will be the featured speaker on Wednesday, Feb. 6, for Communication Visit Day for prospective students. Currently a guest editor on the editorial board of the Boston Globe, she is the founding executive director of Discovering Justice, a democracy and justice education organization based in Boston, Mass. Founded in 1998, the nonprofit organization prepares young people to value the justice system, develop a sense of personal responsibility and respect for others, learn that they can make a difference and embrace civic responsibility. A ground-breaking civics curriulum called "Children Discovering Justice," is taught to children in the Boston public schools. Other activities include mock trials, plays about themes from American constitutional history set in courtrooms as theaters and docent-

led architectual tours. Karagianis also is a principal of MK Directions, a Boston-based firm that consults on strategy with entrepreneurial nonprofit organizations and socially conscious businesses. A recipient of a Pfeiffer Fellowship at Harvard, where she earned a master's degree in world religions, Karagianis also was honored at Harvard with the First Decade Award by the divinity school's Alumni Association "for exemplifying the values of dialogue, creativity, justice and service" in creating Discovering Justice under the auspices of the federal judiciary and Boston Bar Foundation. She will be available for an open discussion on Feb. 5 from 2-3 p.m. in the Cave.

The Toledo Symphony Orchestra will present "An Evening of Distinctively American Music" as a part of the Concert & Lecture Series on Friday, Feb. 1, at the Winebrenner Theological Seminary TLB Auditorium. Selections by American composers, such as Leonard Berstein and Aaron Copland, will be featured. Guest pianist Michael Boyd, professor of piano at the University of Toledo, will perform George Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue." Boyd has performed as a concerto soloist with the Rochester Philharmonic, the Milwaukee Symphony, the Dearborn Symphony and the Eastman Chamber Orchestra. He has given

solo recitals across the United States and in Austria, Belgium, Greece and Spain. A graduate of the North Carolina School of the Arts and the Wisconsin Conservatory of Music, he holds master's and doctoral degrees from the Eastman School of Music. Resident conductor Jeffrey Pollock is in his third year with the Toledo Symphony Orchestra. A graduate of the Peabody Conservatory of Music, Pollock has worked with numerous orchestras across North America and has led major productions for the Baltimore Opera Company and Opera Delaware. Jennifer M. Almjeld's presentation is part of the Wilkin Chair series of events this year. According to Almjeld, "Online daters use templates, images and text to 'write themselves' into the role of dater. The presentation offers an insider look at the Match.com community, focusing on the use of design templates, pull-down menus, and linguistic and visual cues used

Nathan Sommers and Cheryl Cape developed an online management system for the Hancock Park District.

During the summer of 2012, Nathan Sommers, senior UF math major, and Cheryl Cape, UF senior lecturer of natural science, developed an online management system for the Hancock Park District using Geographic Information System (GIS) software. GIS software can be used to track and update data for specific locations. The park district uses the system developed by Sommers to track the upkeep of the parks, log management records and share planning proposals for administration of the natural and recreational areas. Sommers was introduced to GIS technology during a class on the topic (GEOL 410) during the fall 2011 semester and an advanced topics in geology course with Cape during the spring 2012 semester. The information associated with these maps includes

data such as schedules for mowing grass, where seed was planted and when it needs to be planted, when the park rangers need to burn prairie grass in order to allow native vegetation to regenerate, and much more. Cape, who also has done similar volunteer work for the community by providing GIS information to the Northwest Ohio Flood Mitigation Partnership, strongly believes it is a university's responsibility to help and strengthen its surrounding city and community. Dan Yates, Ph.D., associate professor of business, and Chris Ward, Ed.D., associate professor of business and director of experiential learning, student engagement and community

outreach, recently co-authored "The Perception Versus the Reality of Retirement: Are You Ready to Retire?" It was presented at the Clute International Academic Conference in Las Vegas, Nev., in October, and was published in the Journal of Business and Economics Research (January 2013, Vol. 11, No. 1). The paper was reviewed by two independent reviewers and the journal editor in a blind review process. The research leading up to the publication was a collaborative effort between

UF faculty members and a community business partner, Scott Hohman at Strategic Investment Advisors (SIA) in Findlay. Hohman works with clients who are near retirement. His goal was to survey SIA's local clients and then use that information to help people contemplating retirement imagine what the experience may actually look like for them. Yates played a large role in helping Hohman develop a survey instrument, test it and launch it to SIA's client base. Ward, who also teaches business research classes, helped during the review process, as well. Throughout the process, Yates used the experience to demonstrate to his students how what they are learning in class translates into a tangible product. He also invited Hohman to a personal finance class to share the results of the survey and a presentation developed for SIA clients as a result of the work that was done. The Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services has named John Richey one of the 2012 Prevention Innovators of the Year. Richey is the director of UF's health informatics program and received the award for his work on developing a database related to substance abuse trends. Nominated by the Hancock County ADAMHS Board and the Community Partnership, Richey worked extensively with the Hancock County Opiate/Prescription Drug Abuse Task Force to develop the database that can be used to support decisions about local prevention and education programs. Students in the health informatics program helped with the development of the database. Offered as a graduate program in the College of Health Professions, health informatics is the study of

resources and methods for the management of health information. It involves systems such as electronic health records (EHR) and electronic medical records (EMR). For more, <u>click here</u>.

4. Alumni Spotlight

The University of Findlay Athletic Hall of Fame to Induct Seven

The University will induct six former athletes, **Craig Aukerman '99**, **John Dee '88**, **Deanna** (**Behnfeldt**) **McCabe '02**, **Scott McLaughlin '95**, **Willis Tuggle '64** and **Beth (Baldridge) Williams '02**, into its Athletic Hall of Fame during an induction ceremony on Jan. 26 in Winebrenner Theological Seminary. **Steve Williman '80** will be honored as the first recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award. The 39th annual ceremony will be held at 11 a.m. in Winebrenner Theological Seminary's TLB Foundation Convocation Center.

Craig Aukerman '99 was a member of both the 1995 and 1997 NAIA national championship football teams. His skill as a defensive back earned him NAIA All-America honors in both 1997 and 1998, as well as being named to the All-GLIAC First Team Defense in 1998. The Oilers compiled a record of 41-7-2 during Aukerman's career. He also played a season of baseball for the Oilers while a junior. Aukerman became an assistant football coach for the Oilers after graduation, and one season later he joined the staff at Miami University of Ohio. He was a member the football staff at Western Kentucky University for one season and then returned to Miami for three seasons. After a year with the Kent State staff, Aukerman

joined the Denver Broncos as an assistant for the 2010 season. For the past two seasons he has

been an assistant special teams coach with the Jacksonville Jaguars. Currently residing in St. Johns, Fla., Aukerman and his wife, Summer, have two sons, Cayden and Bryce.

Johnny Dee '88 has been described as a baseball pitcher who possessed a "rubber arm," which is a tribute to his physical durability. Nearly 25 years later, Dee still holds the Findlay records for wins in a season (8) and in a career (24), along with the number of games started (47). The four-year starter was named NAIA All-District 22 in 1987. The talented Dee was often utilized as a courtesy base runner when not pitching, and he even played two seasons of varsity soccer for the Oilers. Dee also served as a sports reporter for the Pulse campus newspaper and as an announcer for UF football and basketball. Dee is the human resources manager at The Findlay Publishing Co., where he has been employed for 24 years. He resides in

McComb, Ohio, with his wife, Carla, and has a son, Andrew, and a daughter, Brenna. Dee has served on the McComb School Board and with the McComb Athletic Boosters.

Deanna (Behnfeldt) McCabe '02 helped the Oilers volleyball team earn an NAIA National Tournament berth in 1999, where they finished fifth, and two NCAA Regional Tournament appearances. UF was also a GLIAC South Division champion and a co-champion during her tenure. McCabe is still the leader for kills in a season (701) and career (2,437) at Findlay. She also ranks first in kills per game for a season (4.97) and for a career (4.50). The durable performer is third in games played for a career (542) and third in career hitting percentage (.303) for the Oilers. An armful of honors were earned by McCabe, including three All-GLIAC First Team Awards, an NAIA Region IX First Team and Player of the Year awards and two Daktronics Midwest Region First Team Awards. McCabe was named

GLIAC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and the AVCA Great Lakes Region Scholar-Athlete of the Year as a senior, and the Verizon (GTE) Academic All-America Player of the Year as a junior. McCabe graduated summa cum laude and received the Sharon Milligan Award, the President's Senior Scholar-Athlete Award and the Mancuso Award. She is a surgical nurse at Flower Hospital in Sylvania, Ohio, and lives in Grand Rapids, Ohio, with her husband, Brian, and children, Kayla and Leah.

Scott McLaughlin '95 is the career leader for Oilers football in pass receiving yardage with 2,403 yards on 119 catches, including 32 touchdowns, which is second all-time for the Oilers. The four-year starter was a four-time NAIA All-District 22 selection. McLaughlin received the team's Most Valuable Player Award as both a junior and a senior, and was a member of the 1992 NAIA national championship team. The talented McLaughlin easily transitioned to baseball in the spring, starting for four years and being selected NAIA All-District 22 on two occasions. He remains Findlay's career stolen base leader with 57. McLaughlin has worked as a manager with Coca-Cola in six states over a period of nearly

20 years. He has volunteered in leadership and mentorship programs, has coached youth soccer and football, and has worked with church youth ministries, Junior Achievement and Relay for Life. McLaughlin currently resides in Lithia, Fla., with his wife, Rhonda, and children: Mikayla, Jacob, Emma, Daniel, Laura, Luke and Timothy.

Willie Tuggle '64 earned four letters in basketball while scoring 1,307 points during his career at Findlay, ranking 23rd on the UF career scoring list. He also earned an All Mid-Ohio First Team Award and a Second Team Award, and was named to the NAIA District 22 Second Team as a senior. Tuggle was twice named as the team's Most Valuable Player and twice served as a team captain. Tuggle also earned four letters as a baseball pitcher and posted a 4-1 record when the Oilers were Mid-Ohio co-champions in 1962. Besides being gifted athletically, Tuggle was honored with the first Founder's Day Son Award in 1964. Tuggle resides in Ravenna, Ohio, with his wife of nearly 50 years, Judith, and has a daughter,

Kelly, and a son, Scott. He is a retired English teacher, having first taught for two years in his home state of Indiana and another 35 years with the Akron Public Schools.

Beth (Baldridge) Williams '02 qualified for every indoor and outdoor track and field national championship during her time at Findlay and finished as an All-American in her specialty, the high jump. The eight-time All-American – four times in the NAIA and four times in NCAA II – earned a national championship at the 2000 NAIA outdoor meet. Williams also became the first athlete in UF history to earn NCAA II All-America honors, which she did at the 2001 indoor championships, as well as runner-up honors at the 2002 meet. Williams was a seven-time GLIAC champion, three times indoors and four times outdoors. She was named by the United States Track Coaches Association (USTCA) as a Scholar-Athlete for outdoor track in 2001 and was a member of the GLIAC All-Academic

Team in 2002. She also was selected as the UF Female Athlete of the Year in 2002. She still holds the UF high jump records both indoors (5'8") and outdoors (5'8 1/2"). Currently a K-12 physical education teacher at Upper Scioto Valley High School, Williams lives in Findlay with her husband, Bob, and son, Brayden.

Steve Williman '80, longtime boys basketball coach at Liberty-Benton High School, was selected as the first recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award of the UF Athletic Hall of Fame. The Lifetime Achievement Award was created to honor outstanding Oilers who have attained an extremely high level of success in their industry, sport or profession. Williman began as assistant coach at Liberty-Benton High School in 1978 and held coaching positions at Old Fort High School and Galion High School before returning to Liberty-Benton in 1987, where he continues to teach and coach. Presently in his 32nd year as a basketball coach, Williman began the season with a 510-201 record. Liberty-Benton won the OHSAA

State Championship in 1995 and was runner-up in 2007. The Eagles were AP Poll Champions in 2007, 2008 and 2010 and set a conference record with 42 consecutive wins. Williman was named the Coach of the Year in the Blanchard Valley Conference (11 times), District 8 (three times), District 6, AP Northwest Ohio Division 4 and AP Northwest Ohio Division 3 (twice). Williman was selected as the Ohio Coach of the Year by the National Federation of Coaches Association in 2000. Last year, Williman received the Paul Walker Award from the Ohio High School Basketball Coaches Association. Williman and his wife, Marty, reside in Findlay and are the parents of two adult daughters, Ashlee and Erica.

Football

Senior quarterback Clay Belton represented the Oilers football team in the second annual Casino Del Sol College All-Star Game at Kino Stadium in Tucson, Ariz., on Friday, Jan. 11. Belton threw for a school record 2,329 yards during his final year, along with 15 touchdown passes. He averaged 232.9 yards per game through the air and completed 58.2 percent of his passing attempts. He ended his two-year career ranked second all-time at UF in passing yards (4,368), pass completions (356) and pass attempts (626).
