### Art O'Brien

Art O'Brien has more than 40 years' experience in the equine industry as a trainer, exhibitor, riding instructor, coach and judge. His focus has been primarily on showing performance horses and coaching clients at AQHA events, along with NRHA and NSBA competitions.

An AQHA Professional Horseman and an international clinician, he has won World Champion titles in both AQHA and ApHC in trail, western riding, western pleasure and reining, and his students have won World Champion titles in 12 different events.
