THE PROGRAM

- The University of Findlay is presenting Youth Western Horsemanship Schools to further educate interested riders. The school will offer the same techniques that are taught in the University's Western Equestrian Studies Program. Instruction will be given by Clark Bradley, 2001 AQHA Professional Horseman of the Year, NRHA Hall of Fame and Quarter Horse Congress Hall of Fame Inductee and Steve Brown UF Director of Riding and their assistants. Clark and Steve are NRHA, AQHA and NSBA judges and have judged all over the world including Europe, Australia and Brazil. Instruction will include horsemanship, western pleasure, showmanship, training, showing and the fundamentals of reining.
- Each student will work with their own horse under the personal supervision of the equestrian staff. Lectures and demonstrations will be given daily to enhance students' skills. Along with the individual and class instruction and videotaping, there will be evening video analysis.
- Students also participate in evening recreational activities.
- Applications are processed on a first-come, first-served basis, with limited enrollment. Upon acceptance, a confirmation letter will be sent with further details.
