About The College of Sciences

The mission of the College of Science is to provide students with a rigorous, broad foundation in the sciences, teach them to question critically, communicate effectively, think globally and live ethically. We provide the resources and opportunities for graduates of the College of Sciences to:

- Demonstrate mastery of discipline specific theoretical knowledge, and possess analytical and problem-solving skills required for graduate study, professional school or gainful employment within scientific fields.
- Conduct themselves in an ethical manner concerning their specific discipline's use of theoretical and applied knowledge.

- → A willingness to be a good will ambassador for the College of Sciences throughout the college and University.


University of Findlay

Founded in 1882, the University of Findlay is a forward-looking private University that is constantly seeking ways to better serve students and the community. Consistently ranked in the top tier of Midwestern universities in U.S. News & World Report's "America's Best Colleges," the University has also been regularly recognized as one of the region's best by Princeton Review, and Victory Media Inc. named the University to its Military Friendly Schools list in 2017. The University of Findlay serves over 3,500 students and is the largest private university in northwest Ohio.

The greater Findlay region is an ideal place to live and work. It is located approximately 40 miles south of Toledo and 1 1/2 hours from Columbus, Dayton and Detroit.
