UF to Hold 14th Annual Pharmacy Summer Camp

popular demand, we have expanded
our offerings to allow for two choices
for camp this year. We will offer one
camp June 20-23 and the other
camp July 25-28."

The overnight camps will take place on the University of Findlay campus. All meals and snacks will be provided through the University's dining services. Each camp has availability for 50 students on a first come, first serve basis. Cost to attend is \$350 per student and early registration is recommended as the available spaces fill quickly.

This is a unique opportunity for high school students to explore career options, learn about the role of pharmacists in the healthcare system, and get to know University of Findlay faculty in the <u>College of Pharmacy</u>.

An additional benefit of attending camp is that seniors are given the opportunity to interview for Findlay's unique <u>Pharmacy Program</u> which is one of the few pharmacy programs in the country that includes a directentry pathway in the program from high school.
