
Cancer Fighting Compounds: Pharmacy Students Developing New Drug Faculty Feature: Logan Conley, Pharm. D.

regarding research progress). At the University of Findlay, pharmacy students are combining knowledge from all fields of science to develop an oral compound that targets glioblastomas, the most aggressive form of cancer occurring in the brain. Using chemistry, physiology and pharmacology, they are researching an efficient way to direct medication to the brain. If successful, this kind of medication could remove the need for risky medical procedures which require physical access to the brain tissue. The research is in its infancy; years worth of study remain to determine the drug's efficacy, but the efforts of our faculty and students in this area are an excellent example of the high quality research taking place every day in the UF College of Pharmacy.
